



KIDS DAY AT MIDSTATE MODELERS

EACH SUMMER THE N. SYRACUSE SCHOOL DISTRICT SPONSORS A SUMMER CLASS FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION CHILDREN. THE KIDS ARE PLACED IN SPECIAL EDUCATION BECAUSE OF PHYSICAL HANDICAPS & LEARNING DISABILITIES WHICH MAKE IT DIFFICULT, OR IMPOSSIBLE TO LEARN IN A REGULAR CLASSROOM ENVIRON-MENT. 1 OF THE PROGRAM OBJECTIVES IS TO PROVIDE LEARNING EXPERIENCES ABOUT THE COMMUNITY WHICH WOULD NOT NORMALLY BE AVAILABLE TO THE CHILDREN. ON JULY 21, MIDSTATE MODELERS HOSTED THEIR ANNUAL OUTING FOR THESE KIDS AT THE CLUB FIELD IN CICERO. ABOUT 150 CHILDREN & THEIR TEACHERS ARRIVED AT THE FIELD ON WED. MORNING, BURSTING WITH ENTHUSIASM FOR THE MODEL AIR SHOW THEY HAD BEEN PROMISED; & THANKS TO LLOYD BEAUBIEN (MM), THE ORGANIZER OF THIS FINE EVENT, THEY WERE NOT DISAPPOINTED. AS THE KIDS BOUNCED OFF THE BUSES, THEY MET WITH THE SIGHT OF A GROWN MAN TRYING TO SCREW HIMSELF INTO THE GROUND. IT WAS JIM SAIFF (OMAC, CNYMAA PRESIDENT) DOING A LITTLE U-CONTROL FLYING. "I CAN FLY THAT THING!", SAID JIM. JIM GOT SO DIZZY, HE ENDED UP WITH THE PLANE STATIONARY & HIMSELF DOING CIRCLES AROUND THE FIELD. BUT, STUBBORN PRIDE SHOWING, JIM REFUSED TO FALL DOWN. GEORGE PEEK (MM) THEN DEMONSTRATED HOW TO BUST UP A HAND-LAUNCH GLIDER. ASSISTED BY HIS 8 YR OLD SON DAVE, DAVE'S DEMONSTRATION OF RUBBER-POWERED MODELS WAS MORE SUCCESSFUL. HE THEN PROVIDED AN "ADVANCED" U-CONTROL SHOW, PERFORMING A FEW CIRCLES, LOOPS, FIGURE 88 & WINGOVERS FOLLOW ED BY A RATHER ABRUPT, HIGH IMPACT LANDING. MUTTERING SOMETHING ABOUT RADIO FAILURE, HE SKULKED OFF THE FIELD. "WEREN'T YOU EMBARRASSED?", ASKED SON DAVID. LARRY DUNNING (MM), SENSING THAT THE KIDS WERE GROWING RESTLESS ONLY MINUTES INTO THE SHOW DECIDED TO DO SOME REAL FLYING. FLYING A 3 CH PLANE OF HIS OWN DESIGN, LARRY 1ST DEMONSTRATED ELEMENTARY FLIGHT MANEUVERS, FOLLOWED BY SOME STRANGE AEROBATICS, ALSO OF HIS OWN DESIGN, THAT WERE CLEARLY IMPOSSIBLE WITH A 3 CH AIRPLANE. A LITTLE LATER, LARRY DEMONSTRATED SEVERAL FUN FLY EVENTS, SCORING HIS BEST TOTAL OF THE SEASON. SAVE IT FOR A REAL CONTEST, LARRY. CHARLIE COE (OMAC) & JOHN FISCOE (MM) THEN TEAMED UP TO SHOW OFF BASIC HELICOPTER MANEUVERS. THE ONLY PROBLEM WAS THAT C.C. LEFT HIS TRANSMITTER SWITCH ON WHILE HE WAS CHARGING HIS BATTERIES. So, Charlies chopper got to watch John's go through its paces. Walt Throne (ARCS), who was TRAPPED INTO SERVING AS ANNOUNCER, STEPPED AWAY FROM THE MIKE TO FINISH OFF THE HELICOPTER FLYING WITH SOME RAZZLE-DAZZLE FLYING OF HIS OWN. NEXT UP WAS LON SAUTER (STARS) WHO PROVIDED A PRETTY EXHIBITION OF FREE-STYLE BIPE AEROBATICS, COMPLETE WITH SMOKE SYSTEM. THE TROUBLE WAS THE SMOKE BOMB WOULDN'T IGNITE. LON SAID HE THOUGHT MAYBE HE SHOULDN'T STORE HIS SMOKE BOMBS IN OLD PICKLE JARS ANYMORE. BUT THE FLIGHT WAS GREAT & THE ANNOUNCER "CONVINCED" THE KIDS THAT EXHAUST TRAIL IS BETTER THAN MESSY OLD SMOKE ANYHOW. SOME EXCITING MOMENTS WERE PROVIDED BY DAVE MATHEWSON (ARCS) AS HE FLEW THROUGH HIS NOW-FAMOUS (WELL, AT LEAST LOCALLY) QUICKIE 500 AEROBATICS ROUTINE. & WHAT DO YOU THINK THE KIDS LIKED MOST? LOW FLY-BYS! WITH BLADES OF GRASS TRAILING FROM HIS GEAR, THE KIDS URGED DAVE ON. "LOWER...LOWER...LOWER!", THEY CHANTED. DAVE, NICE GUY THAT HE IS, WAS FACED WITH A CHOICE ... PLEASE THE KIDS BY FLYING INTO THE GROUND OR PLEASE HIMSELF BY BRINGING IT BACK ALIVE. SORRY KIDS, THERE'S A LIMIT TO EVERYTHING. BACK TO THE FLIGHT LINE WENT LON & MARGE SAUTER TO SHOW A FINE DISPLAY OF PRECISION AEROBATICS. THERES NO WAY TO KID AROUND ABOUT SUCH AN EXHIBITION. A REALLY BEAUTIFUL SIGHT, THOSE LARGE & GRACEFUL MANEUVERS. THEN THE KIDS WERE TREATED TO A RARE SIGHT. LARRY APPS (ARCS). I MEAN THAT CAPTAIN LARRY & HIS SPACE SHUTTLE SUPPORT TEAM (DAVE MATHEWSON, TONY CIARPELLI & BRUCE THRONE - ALL ARCS) PROVIDED NOT 1, BUT 2 SUCCESSFUL LAUNCHES & RECOVERY OF LARRY'S BEAUTIEUL SCALE MODEL OF THE SHUTTLE COLUMBIA. THE TREES & SWAMP SURROUNDING OUR FIELD PROVIDED ADDED INCENTIVE TO HIT THE FIELD ON RECOVERY. MISSION ACCOMPLISHED AT CAPE MIDSTATE. BUT NOW I'D LIKE TO SINCERELY THANK EVERYONE WHO CONTRIBUTED TO THE

EVENT. ALTHOUGH HOSTED BY MIDSTATE MODELERS, THE SHOW WAS A COOPERATIVE EFFORT OF MEMBERS OF ALL THE LOCAL CLUBS AS WELL AS THE CNYMAA. WE FEEL IT WAS A WORTHWHILE EVENT FOR THE DELIGHT IT BRINGS TO THE KIDS, & THE WARM FEELING IT GIVES TO THE PEOPLE WHO HELP. & IT IS ALSO REWARDING TO BE A PART OF A TEAM EFFORT MADE UP OF A BUNCH OF GREAT FOLKS, THE RADIO CONTROL MODELLING "NUTS" OF CENTRAL NEW YORK. Wild blue yonder brought down to size


