After a great deal of soul searching, I've decided to trash my current transmitter and build a unit to meet my spec's. An evaluation of the many available options made it intuitively obvious what essential features must be incorporated into the "ULTIMATE TRANSMITTER":

- 1. Triple rate on/off switch
- Mixing option for rudder and variable pitch prop
- Snap landing switch
- No roll button
- Exponential charging jack
- Powered antenna retractor
- 7. Titanium gimbals with polished diamond ball bearings
- Built-in digital ESV/T.V./STP readout in linear and logarithmic mode
- Seven rate aileron
- 10. Second rate quality
- 11. Rudder/retract expo mixing
- Solar cells for authomatic recharging
- "Hail Mary" figure M switch
- 14. 70 turn trim pots
- Reversing switches for all functions except rudder, elevator, ailerons, and throttle
- 16. High and low rate edgeulators
- 17. Grow-your-own transmitter and reciever crystals (That way, nobody will be on my frequency, including me)
- 18. Built-in flight timer that sends 12 megawatts through the sticks into your thumbs every 30 seconds plus a final warning at 9 minutes, 45 seconds that terminally arc welds your thumbs to the sticks
- 19. Easily serviceable by anyone who has a PHD in nuclear physics, is a championship caliber weight lifter and a recreational contortionist. (I suspect this unit "ight be a bit challenging to work on.)

## Tiny airplanes show their stuff in meet

CANASTOTA — Before the wheels of a small red airplane could touch the runway at the airport here yesterday, its wooden propeller abruptly stopped dead.

Even if the plane had nosed into the airstrip instead of making a perfect three-point landing, perhaps nothing more than a heartache would have been suffered.

There were no passengers on the plane. There were, however, a lot of dollars sunk into it.

The 10-pound fiberglass, balsa and polystyrene radio-controlled drone represented an investment of as much as \$1.500.

In flight at the 1982 Firebird Classic, the planes flipped, looped and rolled with a high-pitched whine at the commands of their owners, who stood at the runway's edge and fidgeted with small stick controls.

The weekend event was sponsored by the Mohawk Valley Radio Control Modelers.

Thirty-one "pilots" carted their 1½-horsepower thoroughbreds here this weekend to participate in a contest the Modelers hope will become an annual event.

Many of the pilots said they found their hobby a source of relaxation.

They represented various occupations — doctors, lawyers, and, yes, even pilots.

Barbara Krafft sat behind the roped off contestants area and watched her husband, Don, fly his plane. Don, a pilot for more than 20 years, flies for USAir out of Boston.

"This bothers me more than when he is normally at work — this is nerve wracking," she said. "I hate to see the airplanes break. When he goes to work, I don't worry at all."

Each contestant put his plane through some of the more than 40 different maneuvers.

Some here were novices. Others competed in such classes as sportsman, advanced, expert, masters and scale.

Scale aircraft, as distinct from pattern ships, are replicas of actual airplanes.

As each pilot announced the pattern his plane would follow next, three judges seated in webbed lawn chairs would crane their necks skyward and then flash a scoring card to a nearby scorer.

Each contestant paid \$15 to fly. It cost spectators — of whom there were some 30 on Sunday — \$1 to park.

### DO NOT FLY NEAR HOUSES ラジコン飛行機を飛ばす前に安全を確かめて…

You have to fly airplane in model airplane field which has to be not only big area but also no houses arround there. Model engine makes big noise so you have to use a muffler.

#### BEFORE FLYING, CHECK EVERYTHING FOR SAFETY 近くに人家や道路がないか …

Before fling, check your airplane for Lose parts, bolts and nuts, and tighten them. Model airplanes are very dangerous Check a runway and confirm nobody on it before flying.

There are 6 frequency an 27MHz and 5 frequency on 72MHz for radio control models If somebodyelse fly on same frequency, you cannot fly your model. Put frequency flag on your transmiter for easy confirmation.

### DO NOT FLY NEAR POWER SOURCES OR POWER LINES 高圧線が近くにないこと …

To fly near power line causes radio interference. Moreover if your airplane fly into power line, it causes big accident. Do not fly near power plant or power line.
