

SYSTEM MANUFACTURERS will be able to deliver units on the new channels, and convert many new channels. Any unit purchased today on the existing seven R/C frequencies will not be obsolete. The seven frequencies will be usable for five more years, at which time the frequencies will no longer be authorized for R/C use. A unit can be converted to operate on one of the new channels at any time after they are approved by the FCC.

Present day 72 MHz wideband AM equipment will be able to be used for eight years from the time the FCC approves the new channels. After eight years, most modelers will require a new narrow band receiver capable of operating at 20 KHz channel spacing in intense intermodulation product environment.

MOST MANUFACTURERS plan on making such a receiver available to you in the near future.

The AMA/Industry Phase-in Plan for the new channels was approved by the AMA Executive Council on June 26, 1982, along with a new AMA R/C frequency I.D. and control system. In essence, there will initially be eleven new 72 MHz channels available for <u>aircraft-only</u> use and eleven for <u>non-aircraft</u> use. Other channels will be phased in later, since it is mandatory that we protect the existing seven frequencies and not obsolete current equipment. After eight years all 50 aircraft-only and 30 non-aircraft channels will be available for use, but only with narrow band IM immune equipment.

THE TREASURERS REPORT SHOWED A BALANCE THE ASSOCIATION CHARTER IS STILL BEING WORKED ON BY JIM SAIFF. LARRY ABRAHAM HAVE NOT AS YET GOTTEN TOGETHER ON THE SANCTION FOR OUR PICNIC. GLENN CADY WILL TAKE A CHECK TO LARRY & ASK THAT HE APPLY FOR A SANCTION AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. THERE SEEMS TO BE A BIT OF CONFUSION AS TO WHO IS DOING WHAT CONCERNING THE PIGNIC. SINCE LARRY WAS NOT AT THE MEETING, GLENN CADY OFFERED TO CONTACT HIM & MAKE SURE EVERYTHING IS SET. JIM SAIFF & FRED EDMUNDS WILL TAKE CARE OF THE FOOD & OTHER ITEMS SUCH AS FORKS, KNIVES, PLATES, ETC. WE WILL BUY THE SODA FROM WHAT THE STARS HAD LEFT OVER FROM THEIR FUN FLY. FINAL ARRANGEMENTS WILL BE MADE AT OUR MEETING ON THE 30TH. THE FINAL COUNT ISN'T IN YET, BUT IT LOOKS AS THOUGH THERE SHOULD BE A GOOD TURNOUT IF THE WEATHER IS NICE. DISCUSSION WAS THEN OPENED CONCERNING THE 1983 Symposium. Most who attended the meeting seemed to think that it would be a mistake not TO HOLD A SYMPOSIUM IN 83. A MOTION WAS MADE BY TONY CLARPELLI, 2NDED BY RON LEOPARDI, THAT WE RESCIND OUR PREVIOUS DECISION & HOLD A SYMPOSIUM IN 83. THE MOTION PASSED 9 FOR, 1 OPPOSED, 1 ABSTAINED. A MOTION WAS THEN MADE BY AL MORTENSEN NOT TO HOLD A SYMPOSIUM IN 83, BUT TO HOLD 1 IN 84. THERE WAS NO 2ND TO THE MOTION. DISCUSSION THEN TURNED TO WHAT TYPE OF SYMPOSI-UM WE WANT. LARGE OR SMALL, FOR THE PUBLIC OR JUST FOR THE MODELER, MORE OR LESS ACTIVITIES, & POSSIBLY MOVING TO A DIFFERENT LOCATION. GEORGE MARSH, DAVE MATHEWSON, & GEORGE BEERS RE-PORTED ON VARIOUS LOCATIONS THEY LOCKED INTO AS POSSIBLE SITES FOR THE EVENT. IT WAS DECIDED THAT A COMMITTEE CONSISTING OF BARROW, MARSH, WORTH, SAIFF, MATHEWSON, BEERS, & THRONE WOULD

MEET BEFORE THE NEXT ASSOCIATION MEETING & FORMULATE A PLAN FOR THE 1983 SYMPOSIUM. IT WAS NOTED THAT IN WHATEVER DIRECTION THE SYMPOSIUM GOES, TOTAL SUPPORT & EFFORT WILL BE NEEDED FROM ALL OUR MEMBERS TO MAKE IT A SUCCESS. BECAUSE OF THE LATE DATE THAT WE ARE GETTING STARTED ON THE SYMPOSIUM, THE PRESIDENT CALLED FOR A MEETING IN 2 WEEKS SO THAT NECCESSARY PREPARATIONS CAN GET UNDER WAY & COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENTS CAN BE PASSED OUT. THE NEXT MEETING WILL BE HELD ON THURSDAY, SEPT. 30 AT 7:30PM AT WALT'S.

SYMPOSIUM COMMITTEE MEETING 9-21-82 THIS MEETING WAS HELD TO DISCUSS THE DIRECTION & FORMAT OF THE SYMPOSIUM, TO FORMULATE OUR IDEAS CONCERNING THE SYMPOSIUM, & RETURN WITH OUR SUGGES-TIONS TO THE NEXT GENERAL ASSOCIATION MEETING SEPT. 30. IT WAS DECIDED THAT GEORGE PEEK & WALT THRONE WILL GO-CHAIR THIS YEARS SYMPOSIUM. THEY WILL DIVIDE THE VARIOUS COMMITTEES A-MOUNGST THEMSELVES. IT WAS DECIDED THAT THE SYMPOSIUM SHOULD STAY PRETTY MUCH AS IT HAS BEEN FOR THE LAST FEW YEARS (CATER TO BOTH THE MODELERS & THE PUBLIC), BUT THAT WE SHOULD CHANGE SOME ASPECTS OF THE PROGRAM TO ADD NEW LIFE & ENTHUSIASM TO THE EVENT. WITH THIS IN MIND, &WITH INFORMATION CONCERNING OTHER MEETING FACILITIES IN THE AREA, IT WAS DECIDED THAT THE ART & HOME CENTER WOULD BE THE ONLY PLACE AT THIS TIME THAT COULD SUIT OUR NEEDS. THE FOLLOWING ARE OUR SUGGESTIONS: PROGRAMS- THE PROGRAMS SHOULD LEAN TOWARDS MORE BASIC ASPECTS OF MODEL-ING. POSSIBLY A SEMINAR ON MONOKOTING, RADIO INSTALLATION, BASIC CONSTRUCTION, ETC. THE SPEAKERS DON'T HAVE TO BE WELL KNOWN MODELERS & COULD JUST AS WELL BE SOMEONE LOCAL. STATIC DISPLAY- POSSIBLY LOWER OR ELIMINATE THE ENTRANCE FEE FOR MODELS. USE THE PRIZES THAT ARE DO-NATED FOR THE STATIC DISPLAY INSTEAD OF THE RAFFLE. THE STARS HAVE AGREED TO RUN THE DISPLAY SO IT WILL BE THEIR RESPONSIBILITY TO DETERMINE CATAGORIES & WHAT TROPHIES WILL BE AWARDED. RAFFLE- THE MASS MAILING TO ALL ASSOCIATION MEMBERS WORKS WELL & SHOULD BE DONE AGAIN THIS YEAR. IT MIGHT BE A GOOD IDEA TO RAFFLE OFF A TELEVISION OR MICROWAVE INSTEAD OF A RC SYSTEM TO GAIN THE INTEREST OF NON MODELERS. THIS NEEDS TO BE STARTED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. STAND- IF THERE ARE NO VOLUNTEERS TO RUN THE FOOD STAND IT SHOULD BE FARMED OUT TO AN OUTSIDE SOURCE. THE PROFIT LAST YEAR WAS SUBSTANTIAL, BUT THE JOB TAKES A LOT OF TIME & EFFORT. THE MENU NEED NOT BE AS ELABORATE AS IN THE PAST. THIS WOULD ELIMINATE SOME OF THE WORK. ADMIS-SIONS- RON LEOPARDI WILL HANDLE THIS. WE NEED A BETTER SYSTEM AS FAR AS HOW MANY PEOPLE ARE COMING THROUGH THE DOOR. POSSIBLY ELIMINATE TICKETS & PAY AS YOU ENTER. MOVIES- CHANGE FOR-MAT TO VTR SETUP IN 2 OR 3 LOCATIONS THROUGHOUT THE BUILDING. GET AS MANY NEW FILS AS POSSIBLE. POSSIBLY INSTRUCTIONAL FILMS SUCH AS THE 1 ON HOT STUFF TIPS. DEALER BOOTHS & SWAP SHOP- DEAL-ER BOOTHS SHOULD STAY THE SAME BUT POSSIBLY RAISE THE RENTAL FEE. THE SWAP SHOP SHOULD BE DROPPED. CLUB BOOTHS- POSSIBLE GO TO INSTRUCTIONAL FORMAT. COVERING DEMOS, BUILDING, ENGINE MAINTENANCE, ETC. MAYBE ON THE HOUR DEMOS. PUBLIC RELATIONS- THE TV PROMOTION DIDN'T WORK AS WE HAD HOPED. IT SHOULD BE DROPPED FROM THIS YEARS BUDGET. SYMPSOIUM BANQUET- WE SHOULD DE-FINITELY HAVE A DINNER & IT SHOULD INCLUDE INVITATIONS TO SPEAKERS & ANY OUT OF TOWN VIPS. MISCELLANEOUS- WE SHOULD INVITE THE CAR CLUB, BOAT CLUB, PLASTICS CLUB, & EAA TO HAVE A BOOTH AT THE SYMPOSIUM. IF THEY WANT TO HOLD THEIR OWN STATIC COMPETITION THAT'S FINE, BUT LETTING THEM ENTER OUR DISPLAY HASN'T WORKED OUT WELL. THE \$50 FEE PAID TO SPEAKERS SHOULD BE RAISED THIS YEAR. THE SUCCESS OF THE SYMPOSIUM DEPENDS ON THE AMOUNT OF HELP WE GET FROM MEMBER CLUBS.

IF EACH CLUB WOULD TAKE 2 COMMITTEES, THE WORK LOAD WOULD BE DISTRIBUTED EVENLY & WOULD MAKE THE DAY MORE ENJOYABLE FOR EVERYONE. BELOW IS A LIST OF COMMITTEES & WHO, SO FAR, HAS AGREED TO CHAIR THEM. THERE ARE SOME MAJOR COMMITTEES THAT SHOULD BE FILLED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE SO WORK CAN BEGIN ON THEM. IF THEY CAN'T BE FILLED IN THE NEAR FUTURE, THE SUCCESS OF THE SYMPOSIUM WOULD BEPUT IN DOUBT. THEREFORE, IF MOST OF THESE COMMITTEES ARE NOT FILLED BY THE END OF SEPTEMBER THEN MAYBE WE SHOULD CONSIDER NOT HOLDING A SYMPOSIUM THIS YEAR.


