However, there were certainly some good looking scale aircraft on display. Sport aircraft were not neglected & were well represented. wandered over to watch the flight simulator being operated by the East Hill Flying Club. I also wandered around the Static Display conducted by 2 Ultalight firms. Each had a bird to show & each were very informative & willing to answer my silly questions. You know, questions like: "What's the compression ratio of that 2 cycle engine?", "What diameter & pitch prop do you use on that thing?" & "Do any of these birds come as biplanes?". Monroe Payne of Ithaca Model Systems had a display & donated a Midwest Attacker kit for a raffle prize. Bauman's Hobby & Craft's also had a display. 

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

Note that the calling list has been divided into three groups of senior members. This will form our telephone notification list for 1983. I will call the first member of each group. Each one of those three will in turn call the member under him. Then the second member will call the third and so forth until the last name in each group is reached. If you can not reach the next member, bypass him and call the next member after him. But DO NOT break the chain.

CLUB JACKETS

I have gotten a price for lined navy blue jackets based on an order of at least 25 pieces. If we want to order jackets with our logo done in white, the cost per jacket is \$15.50, with a screen set up of \$25 (which the club has voted to pay).
