



FROM ALL I READ & HEAR, THE NATS AT CHICOPEE, MASS. THIS YEAR ARE WELL ON THEIR WAY. I HOPE TO HAVE EVENT SCHEDULES & SIGN UP SHEETS SHORTLY FOR THOSE OF YOU WISHING TO PARTICIPATE IN THIS SPECTACULAR EVENT. HIS YEARS NATS WILL TAKE A NEW FORMAT IN THAT IN ADDITION TO THE USUAL COMPETITION THERE WILL ALSO BE SPEAKERS, STATIC DISPLAYS, U.S. AIR FORCE DISPLAYS, & MUCH MORE FOR THE COMPETITOR, THE MODELER & THE SPECTATOR. THE DATES ARE JULY 24TH THROUGH AUGUST 31ST, SO PLAN TO ATTEND. IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, OR WISH TO SIGN UP TO WORK AT THE NATS, PLEASE CONTACT ME ASAP. IN RESPONSE TO THE MANY QUESTIONS ABOUT THE NEW FREQUENCIES, I HAVE GIVEN TALKS AT A NO. OF THE LOCAL CLUBS & WILL CONTINUE TO DO SO AS REQUESTED. BELOW IS A FREQUENCY CONTROL SYSTEM YOU MAY WANT TO USE AT YOUR FIELD TO MINIMIZE ANY POSSIBLE INTERFERENCE PROBLEMS. GEORGE MYERS, OUR DIST. FREQUENCY COORDINATOR, WORKED UP THIS PROCEEDURE & WILL BE PUBLISHING IT IN MODEL AVIATION. THIS SYSTEM USES THEORETICAL INTERFERENCE CONDITIONS TO GROUP FREQUENCIES THAT HAVE THE LEAST POSSIBILITY OF INTERFERENCE WHEN USED SIMULTANEOUSLY. WHILE IT IS POSSIBLE TO FLY SIMULTANEOUSLY ON FREQUENCIES IN THE SAME GROUP, IT IS THEORETICALLY THE SAFEST TO FLY SIMULTANEOUSLY WITH FREQUENCIES IN DIFFERENT GROUPS. IF YOU WISH TO ADOPT THIS SYSTEM THE METHOD IS AS FOLLOWS: DECIDE HOW MANY AIRPLANES YOUR CLUB WISHES TO FLY SIMULTA-NEOUSLY. MAKE A BOARD WITH THE NUMBER OF SIDES CORRESPONDING TO THE NUMBER SELECTED, I.E. 4 PLANES IN THE AIR, YOU WOULD MAKE A SQUARE. NEXT, GO TO THE CHART & LIST THE FREQUENCIES FOR GROUP A ON ONE SIDE, GROUP B ON ANOTHER SIDE, ETC. THE CORNERS CAN BE DESIGNATED AS WAITING AREAS. EACH MEMBER MAKES HIS OWN CLOTHESPIN, WITH HIS FREQUENCY & NAME. UPON ARRIVAL AT THE FIELD, HE PUTS HIS CLOTHESPIN IN THE WAITING AREA OF HIS RESPECTIVE GROUP, & WHEN IT'S HIS TURN TO FLY, HE MOVE'S HIS CLOTHESPIN TO THE FREQUENCY HE'S USING. SUBSEQUENT MODELERS IN HIS GROUP WOULD WAIT UNTIL HE LANDS BEFORE OPERATING THEIR SYSTEM IN THAT GROUP. THIS IS AN IDEAL SYSTEM FOR USE AT CONTESTS WHERE YOU HAVE 2 THROUGH 5 FLIGHT LINES & DESIRE THE ULTIMATE IN FREQUENCY CONTROL. AS WE PHASE OUT OUR OLDER SYSTEMS, & NEWER NARROW BAND RECEIVERS BECOME AVAILABLE, THE NECCESSITY TO USE THIS SYSTEM AT THE FIELD WILL DECREASE. HOWEVER, PRESENTLY IN THIS AREA, WE HAVE MANY OLDER RADIOS IN USE & IN THE INTEREST OF SAFETY & COOPERATION WITH YOUR FELLOW MODELER I WOULD SUGGEST YOU TRY THIS SYSTEM & SEE HOW IT WORKS.






Well, spring is coming as you can tell when you look out your window. We should have called our Winter Snow Fly a Pre-Spring Mud Fly, since there
