

June 16, 1983

At 8:35 P.M., at the Oneida River Tavern, Pres. Lon Sauter called the meeting to order.

Roll call was taken and the attached sheet shows the attendees. Guests were Betty Cusens and Garry Barrow.

Secretary read minutes of last meeting (May 19, 1983) and one error was noted. Lon Sauter, not Guy Cusens, sent the plaque to John Franke.

Treasurer reported that the Association now has \$659.37 in checking account, and \$2.944.51 in savings account.

Old Business

An expenditure of \$64.07 was made to purchase four (4) new digital stop watches for association members' use.

Lon Sauter read letter he sent to John Franke, along with the plaque.

Lon also read an AMA report concerning the Omahawks law suit. It was emphasized that if the club had been AMA sactioned, AMA would have covered their legal expenses.

A new home-owners insurance policy is soon to be available, covering certain losses of your own aircraft. More information coming soon via Model Aviation.

We have again been reminded that AMA insurance coverage dictates that our aircraft carry owner I.D. This includes Name, Address and AMA Membership Number.

Due to lack of participation, bus transportation for the 1983 NATS will not be arranged for by the CNYMAA.

Concerning storage of the equipment owned by the CNYMAA, a change has taken place since last meeting. All equipment except the Motor/Generator will still be available at Walt's Hobbies in Fairmount. The power unit is at George Beers home. A list of available equipment is being compiled and will be available soon.

Guy Cusens made the motion that the Association purchase a 50 foot, 12 gauge extension cord to be associated with our Motor/Generator. Motion seconded by George Beers. Motion defeated.

New Business

The Secretary announced that he is no longer a member of the Auburn Finger Lakes Radio Control Club due to his resignation. Not being a Club representative, does he still qualify to hold office in the Association? Much discussion ensued and by-laws checked, and it was determined that officers need not be Club representative. As such he/she has no vote.

The aforementioned incident prompted the President to appoint a committee to review and update the Association constitution, and report their recommendations at the September meeting. This committee consists of George Beers, Al Mortensen and Guy Cusens.

Next meeting, July 21, 1983, at 7:30 P.M. at Oswego Valley Modelaires (0.V.M.) field.

Meeting adjourned at 9:20 P.M.


