Most of the modelers I've come in contact with during my modeling career, profess to be sport flyers and want nothing to do with competition. ly enough however, a good number of these sport flyers have tried a local intra club competitive event and found it to be a lot of fun. With the increasing numbers of fly-in events, i.e. the STAR SPANGLED RALLY in Olean, it appears modelers like to get together to fly and talk about their hobby. Contests accomplish this objective and also add a little spice in the form of challenging ones flying skills, or in some cases, just your luck. The AMA makes a gallant effort at trying to coordinate the many different kinds of contests and their dates throughout the year. This job is accomplished by the contest coordinator for the event the contest offers. If your club is planning to hold a contest, and would like to sanction it with the AMA, it is a good idea to plan your date well in advance and submit your sanction request in a timely manner. This allows the contest coordinator ample time to schedule contests of similar types without conflicts. Also, it's a good idea to plan an alternate date that can be used in case of a conflict. your club has any questions on the process of sanctioning a contest, feel free to call me. The STARS selected another great day for racing, sailboat racing that is. The high winds definitely were a factor in many flights. Several Novice class novices nearly went out of sight on their down wind leg while attempting to land, and as a result, they all took a stroll through the corn. George "FC-2" Clapp, Bruce "Bad Luck" Throne and Roy Catholdi all pulled off corn capers. Didn't anyone check to see if it was field or sweet?

In Novice class, Tony Ciarapelli had the fastest time at 2:54 and the most points at 9. George Clapp, when not prancing through the corn, fumbled

the sticks accurately enough to get 7 pts., with several very good flights. Lloyd Beaubien was also back; and despite some shakey takeoffs and weed landings (how can anyone miss all the freshly mowed green grass?), he managed to earn 6 pts with his "patchwork plane". Gary Rizzo of the Midstate club was also on hand trying to race with his self proclaimed illegal Quickie called "Outlaw". "out" all right, way outside the pylons. He earned 6 pts. Gary Brown was also back with his red racer, and this time he got the thing off the ground and kept it in the air long enought to earn 7 pts. Roy Catholdi flew his Ugly Stick airplane to earn 3 pts. During his 1st heat, he ran out of fuel and dumped his crate into the corn. On his 3rd heat, he again ran out of fuel and had to glide

across the finish line, nearly not making it. Roy got 3 pts. Last but not least is Bruce "Bad Luck" Throne, who demolished a plane at the first race of the season and repeated the performance again Saturday. His model evidently suffered some damage during his "corn" crash and after rounding #3 pylon the wing departed with a loud snap. The fuselage sailed on for another 10 yds. and totaly destroyed itself on the edge of the field. However, the wing remained in perfect shape ready for the next race. No doubt Walt will loan Bruce his own personal Quickie for the next race, as I'm certain nothing could possibly happen this

The showing was a bit scant in Expert class this time, with only 3 entrants; but the flying was no less spectacular than Novice class.

Heinley, who has not completely lost his sandbagging habit, earned 2 pts., Don Belfort 4 pts., and "Lightning" Lon Sauter with 6 pts. and best time Now all of you are probably of 2:18.

Don was last seen sprinting around the pylons with his Scat Cat in his raised right hand shouting "this is how you do it, dummy"!
