

We have had some crashes in the pit area when a pilot was taking off his airplane.

I'd like to suggest that everyone in the pit area should keep their eyes on any plane taking off, to make sure that it has taken off safely. You should also pay attention when a plane is landing. Accidents do happen, but we would like to try and stay one step ahead of having any serious injuries. I hope everyone will heed this suggestion; any other ideas they might have should be mentioned at our next meeting. As I've said before, you can never talk too much about safety.
