PSST!

FOR THOSE OF YOU WHO HAD THE CHANCE TO TASTE THE "BANANA SPLIT PIE" AT THE OVM/STARS ... HERE'S THE RECIPE (compliments of Mark DiGregorio) ... BOY WAS IT GREAT!

Banana Split Pie (makes 2)

Beat 2 sticks of butter, 2 eggs, 1 lb. of confectioners sugar, & 1/2 tsp. vanilla extract with electric mixer for 20 minutes. Pour into pie pan lined with a graham cracker pie crust.

Mix 4 large bananas (diced) and one #2 can drained crushed pineapple. Spoon on top of first layer of pie. Spread 1 container of thawed cool whip over bananas and pineapple. Sprinkle 1/2 cup of chopped maraschino cherries and 1/2 cup of chopped nuts over cool whip. Drizzle chocolate syrup over pie. Refrigerate pies before serving.

This letter is in regards to an idea of mine I wish to propose to you, as my district II Vice-President, and the AMA.

My idea is that the AMA could run a <u>Say No to Drugs - Get High on Model Aviation</u> campaign of sorts to parallel the national anti-drug campaign. With the power of the press (<u>Model Aviation</u>), the power of the people (the AMA membership), and the power of influence (through clubs, associations and hobby shops), the AMA could reach many people, members and non-members. I feel if done properly, the <u>Say</u> <u>No to Drugs - Get High on Model Aviation</u> campaign could benefit the AMA and its members in many ways.

First, I feel it would take a minimal amount of space in the <u>Model Aviation</u> to carry this promotion. Secondly, I think an embroidered patch depicting the <u>Say No to Drugs - Get High on Model Aviation</u> slogan in the AMA Supply and Service Catalog would coincide nicely with this promotion. Thirdly, a couple of junior member only achievement patches could be worked up in anticipation of increased junior membership.

All of this together could benefit the AMA and the sport of model aviation by bettering relations with those outside of and not familiar with our sport. It should also increase our junior membership by encouraging our adult members to procure memberships for their children.

After all, this is a hobby-sport that brings out the youth in all of us and the youth are not only the future of our country, but of our hobby.

I would be very interested in hearing your thoughts on this idea, and if you think it should be promoted to the AMA Executive Council I would welcome your advice and assistance.
