Minutes of 9-12-90 meeting

19 members, 1 associate member, & 1 guest present. Meeting was called to order by President Dan Williams at 7:02pm. Minutes of previous meeting were approved. Treasurers report was given & approved.

Association Report: Details of picnic were discussed & approved. Club Booth locations for next Symposium will be drawn from hat. Plans for Symposium are well under way.

AMA Report: Lon mentioned that there is a dispute regarding Gold stickers for transmitters & narrow bands. AMA frequency committee is rewriting specs regarding frequency regulating. Field Report: New fence is in. Lon made a motion we allocate up to \$700 for driveway stone & leveling, plus stone for parking area. Prugger will recheck costs. Lisle seconded this motion. Carried unanimously. Field committee will study method of building a structure at each end of culvert to prevent the spread of driveway stone. Lon will check into battery situation in old mower. We should use new mower on flying field only. Use old mower for other parts. Lon will check into adding rollers on new mower to prevent blade & belt damage. He will also check into new wind sock.

<u>Rylon Racing:</u> More help is needed at races. Several members agreed to help at Sept. 16 races.

Flight School: Art Rose mentioned that everything is progressing well. It was decided to change training time to Saturdays because of shorter evenings now. Lon suggested that we check off new fliers & give them "wings" where possible. A list of new fliers will be made. We believe this to be worthy of mention in District 2 write-up in the AMA report. We will send in information & photographs.

<u>Old Business:</u> Air Show was a huge success. Lisle suggested we use soft drink dispensers at next years Air Show to save money & no returns. It was also suggested, at next years show, we provide a small gift for our requested demonstrators, and the reduction of open flying time.

New Business: If you invite a guest to fly, make sure you are with him when he is flying. When the farmer is working in the fields, be sure to keep a good distance away from him with your plane. Glenn Cady suggested we replace small stones in walkway in front of pavilion with flagstones. This was considered to be a good idea, but we decided to shelve it to a later date. Lon made a motion that members joining club after Sept 1st, be given a \$25 credit for the following years dues. Lisle seconded & carried unanimously. We voted in & welcomed new Associate

members Dean Monticelli, Greg Jagiello, Don Rasmussen, & Jr. member Michael Pauldine. Motion for adjournment was made & seconded at 8:53pm.


