Peter, AMA, and the MOST are all very enthusiastic about this program and it's potential to promote the hobby and bring in new members. Peter's guest, Dustin Angel, is from the MOST. Dustin is a long time friend of STARS member Jim Mirra. Dustin detailed the program that Peter outlined in the March Propwash.

The MOST's new exhibit is Flight and Space. The goal is to get the public excited about flying. The exhibit is interactive. They have micro MCX helicopters that can be flown inside the exhibit. Walt's has prepared planes and rockets for them to

display in the exhibit. The Flight and Space exhibit needs flyers to come in on the

first Saturday of each month to do a presentation and show off their personal r/c planes and helicopters.

	Launch Saturday, June 5 at 9 ам
TWO DIVISIONS	Middle School (4th through 8th grades) and High School (9th through 12th grades) School teams should consist of four to five students.
	Sign up to design, build and fly a high-power rocket. Your school will receive materials, rocket simulation software and training to build a rocket capable of lifting an electronic payload with "eggstronaut" to peak altitudes between 200 and 400 meters. A general informational meeting in April will take place at the MOST, where we will distribute materials to school teams and associated school instructors. Each rocket will carry a video and audio acquisition device with real time transmission back to the launch site, and a high speed digital altitude recorder.
	The school teams design and build their rockets to be ready for flight on Saturday, June 5 at the Syracuse University Skytop launch site.
CRITERIA	 Competition and judging of the rocket teams include: Aesthetic look of the rocket, Student presentation, which incorporates relevant technical knowledge, A successful flight, Successful "eggstronaut" payload recovery, and Precision in estimating the apogee of your rocket. College faculty and professional engineers will judge and present awards to the winning teams. All team members will receive certificates of participation and the three top teams in each of the two divisions will receive school plaques. Participants in the CNY Rocket Team Challenge will experience team work and computer design; learn the fundamentals of rocket science with components of electrical, mechanical and chemical engineering; and experience the thrill and exhilaration of high power rocketry!
